II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Schweitzer entertained a motion to approve the November 18, 2020 Policy Committee minutes.

MOTION by Naramore, SUPPORT by Weersing, to approve the November 18, 2020 Policy Committee minutes. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

III. OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

Joseph instructed members of the public to raise their hand by clicking the hand icon if they wished to provide comment verbally. They would then be unmuted. She asked that they unclick the hand icon when they were finished providing comment. After public comments were received, committee members would be given a chance to offer comments. No comments were received by the public or committee members.

IV.

TIP AMENDMENTS

Referring to Item IV: Attachment A, Joseph introduced the TIP amendments that were being requested, which are as follows:

- MDOT requested the amendments/modifications to the TIP project list in the pending projects summary in the agenda, which included "abandoning" a regionwide pavement marking project and adding a project to the FY2021 Trunkline Road GPA, which has triggered a threshold amendment. MDOT also requested committee review of the S/TIP exempt project list. Many of the projects on this S/TIP exempt list have been reviewed by the Committees in the past.
- The City of Grand Rapids has received grants for two FY2022 safety projects and requested to add them to the TIP, which has triggered a threshold amendment for the FY2022 Local Traffic Operations and Safety GPA. Grand Rapids also requested to remove a FY2022 project from the TIP after initial design discussions have indicated the need to increase the scope for the project. They are requesting to add the federal budget associated with this removed project to an existing FY2022 TIP project, increasing that project's federal budget.
- Staff, on behalf of the City of Lowell, requested to modify the scope and construction length of a statewide TAP funded project. This project is also moving from FY2021 to FY2023.

Dennis Kent and Naramore provided additional information about MDOT's and the City of Grand Rapids' requested amendments/modifications.

Schweitzer entertained a motion to approve the requested amendments/modifications to the FY2020-2023 TIP.

MOTION by Naramore, SUPPORT by Holtvluwer, to approve the TIP amendments requested by the MDOT, the City of Grand Rapids, staff and the City of Lowell. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY by roll call vote.

V. ADJUSTED NHS BRIDGE CONDITION TARGETS

Referring to Item V: Attachment A, Joseph explained that, in accordance with federal performance measure requirements, MDOT established Bridge Condition targets in 2018, which the Technical and Policy Committees elected to support. We have now reached the mid-point of the performance period, which allows for adjustment of the 4year targets. Based on updated data, MDOT has elected to adjust their 4-Year Bridge Performance Targets, which are listed below.

- Percentage of NHS bridges classified as in "Good" condition
- Percentage of NHS bridges classified as "Poor" condition

Factors that led to MDOT adjusting their 4-year targets include four large-deck-area bridges deteriorating faster than expected and changes in the inventory of NHS

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bridges, which the adjusted targets account for. A table summarizing the old and new targets and data is below.

MPOs have until March 31, 2021 to take action on these updated targets and can continue to support State targets or develop MPO targets. This item is being brought to the Committee today so that there is ample time for discussion before the deadline.

Staff has participated in target coordination meetings and working groups throughout the development process of all the State targets that have been presented to the Committee and believe the State's methodology for target development to be reasonable. For this reason, and because MDOT selects the recipients of local bridge funds in addition to allocating state bridge funds, staff is recommending that the Policy Committee support the state targets for the updated Bridge Performance Measures at this time. The Technical Committee recommended support of the revised targets at their meeting earlier this month. The generally better condition of NHS bridges in the GVMC area and the work that continues to be done by MDOT and our local agencies to improve NHS bridges in our region can support statewide target achievement.

Naramore asked what the ability to be able to downgrade the bridge target in the middle of a four-year cycle means when trying to prep a conversation about deficient infrastructure and about the intent of the bridge program, including whether it was underfunded, and how this relates to the MPO boundary. Joseph explained that if the State doesn't meet the bridge targets, there shouldn't be financial implications because the state's current level of spending is high enough it would match the potential penalty. She added that bridges in GVMC's MPO area are performing ahead of the statewide average. Tyler Kent explained that targets for bridge condition can be updated more easily because the performance period is longer, and that part of the adjustment is a measure of progress based on data. The Transportation Asset Management Council is another good resource for information on bridges. LaGrand asked what the categories are for bridge classification, and Joseph responded that they are "good, fair, poor," but numerous measures are used to make that categorization. Joseph added that she could provide additional information on this, if needed. Discussion ensued.

Schweitzer entertained a motion to approve the adjusted NHS bridge condition targets.

MOTION by Naramore, SUPPORT by Holtvluwer, to approve the State's adjusted NHS bridge condition targets. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY by roll call vote.

VI. ITS UPDATE

Tyler Kent introduced this item to the Committee, noting that at the last MPO Certification, FHWA brought up additional opportunities for efficient collaboration between agencies on ITS initiatives. Approximately 10 years ago, there was a standing ITS group, and they are looking to revitalize that committee. Allison Balogh shared a presentation that covered an ITS Architecture Update, a WMTOC update, and ITS projects from 2021-2025.

Naramore asked several questions, including if the new ITS architecture will prepare us for future technology, what is the future of DSRC policy, if the focus on connected vehicles on the east side of the state will be brought to the west side, and how the ITS architecture and MDOT will be working with the Office of Future Mobility and Electrification. Naramore also commented that the City of Grand Rapids is interested in getting an ITS working group back together and that most of the funding was focused on freeway projects, but more attention is needed for arterials.

Balogh responded that arterial management is a goal of their ITS architecture, which is their long-range plan, and they are making progress in this area. They are also analyzing how freeway backups impact arterials. As for connected vehicles, she is waiting on the answer to the DSRC from the feds and others at the national level. They are waiting for more connected vehicle density in our area to implement solutions, but it is on their radar. Tyler Kent commented that MDOT would be working with the new Office of Future Mobility and Electrification at the statewide level.

VII. OTHER BUSINESS

Dennis Kent announced that there will be a construction coordination meeting on February 3 in place of the February Technical Committee meeting. Art Green (MDOT) would be hosting the meeting, and all are welcome to attend. Green stated that the idea is to talk about coordinated efforts for the 2021 construction season to ensure that there aren't conflicts and to discuss future projects as well. Joseph will forward the invitation.

Tyler Kent announced that the US 131 PEL study phase one survey is available and that they are receiving lots of comments. He added a link to the survey to the chat pod.

Joseph announced that she is preparing to develop the FY2022 UPWP, and as part of this effort, she would like to incorporate an illustrative list of planning projects from Committee members. She will be sending out a call for projects via email soon asking for proposals. Projects should have a multi-jurisdictional scope and a regional benefit. Once the list is compiled, she will report back to the Committee. Turnaround time would be approximately two weeks for submissions. Ries asked how priorities have been determined in the past, and Joseph responded that previous special planning studies were multi-jurisdictional, and jurisdictions who submitted the projects and/or benefitted from them needed to provide a local match. Naramore was supportive of this approach and recommended that a small subgroup of Tech and Policy members be convened prior to the March meeting to discuss this further and asked that he be updated about what focus areas come out of GVMC's February 1st UPWP meeting with MDOT. He noted that, in the past, GVMC has historically left PL funds on the table and given

credits back to members. He asked that GVMC fill the UPWP with more items to utilize this funding, like bolstering regional travel demand management and talking about freight and goods service delivery —especially first mile and last mile issues and how goods are being distributed. Discussion ensued.

 The City of Grand Rapids is requesting to increase the local and total budgets for a FY2021 resurfacing project, which has triggered a threshold increase amendment for the FY2021 Local Road GPA. The federal funding associated with this project will not change (please see attachments).

Schweitzer entertained a motion to approve the TIP amendments, as requested.

MOTION by Brod, SUPPORT by Schmalzel, to approve the TIP amendments requested by the City of Grand Rapids. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY by roll call vote.

V. PROPOSALS FOR ILLUSTRATIVE LIST OF PLANNING STUDIES—

Referring to Item V: Attachment A, Joseph explained that, GVMC staff is in the process of developing the draft FY2022 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), which incorporates all federally assisted state, regional, and local transportation planning activities proposed to be undertaken in the region during the fiscal year as well as GVMC's annual operating budget. It provides a process for the coordination and collaboration of transportation planning activities in the study area and is required as a basis and condition for all federal funding assistance for transportation planning.

In order to make sure the MPO continues to expand our planning programs in ways that serve the members and benefit the region, staff has requested proposals for planning work that members would like to see GVMC participate in in the coming years and incorporate into future year UPWPs as funding constraints allow. Because the revenue picture for future years is unknown, these proposals will be compiled into an illustrative list of planning projects/studies that staff will draw upon when developing the FY2022 UPWP and future year work programs. Discussion ensued.

1st Project Proposal – Ford Airport Secondary Access

Nemeth presented for Ries, explaining that, in line with the 2020 GVMC "2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan" and air transportation need #1 (chapter 5), a feasibility study for an additional, secondary access route to the airport is necessary. Specifically, alternatives to relieve capacity and safety/security constraints of a single entry to the terminal facilities will be evaluated. The feasibility study will incorporate considerations for regional access including Kent County Road Commission needs and opportunity for a multi-modal connection via rail adjacent to the airport.

Dennis Kent noted the relation of this proposal to the MDOT East Side Airport Access Study Proposal.

2nd Project Proposal – East Side Airport Access Study

Dennis Kent presented, explaining that, this is a continuation and a more focused follow-up to previous MPO studies which resulted in the new I-96/36th Street interchange. This study will identify needs, evaluate access options, and assess impacts to the local and state transportation network, east of the GR Ford International Airport. Growth at the Airport, land use and travel pattern changes, and multi-modal cargo transportation needs in the study area will be considered. In addition to the Airport, residents and businesses in the surrounding area have identified challenges to accessing the freeways from county roads. Conceptual improvement options will be identified, resulting in more detailed subsequent planning. Alternative analysis, NEPA and engineering activities.

Warren showed support for the 1st and 2nd project proposals on behalf of KCRC, suggesting both proposals are combined. Schweitzer showed support as well.

3rd Project Proposal – Regional Non-Motorized Traffic Counting

Bennett presented, explaining the goal of the proposal is to establish a regional data collection process/standard for bicycle, pedestrian, and trail data collection based on NCHRP and other guidance. Fund purchase of equipment to regularly collect data for GVMC communities. Supports non-motorized data inputs for the regional traffic demand model, which is sparse now; REGIS could serve as the repository for the data.

Bennett stated the City of Grand Rapids already has applicable equipment and would like to join forces with GVMC and other regional jurisdictions. Tyler Kent asked if GVMC was involved with the City of Grand Rapids' non-motorized counts pilot project. Joseph said no. Schweitzer expressed support for the proposal.

4th Project Proposal – Regional TDM Strategy

Naramore presented, explaining the goal of the proposal is to develop a coordinated regional transportation demand management strategy that includes recommend funding sources, lead agencies, realistic mode shift goals, and outlines implementation strategies for cities and the Rapid to implement.

LaGrand expressed support for the proposal, noting the relation a well-planned transportation system has on housing. Monoyios expressed support.

5th Project Proposal – West Michigan Express

Strikwerda presented, explaining the goal of the proposal is to provide modeling/analysis to determine public transportation need for the Grand Rapids to Holland corridor to evaluate the potential change in ridership needs due to the impact of COVID.

Kilborn expressed support on behalf of Ottawa County.

6th Project Proposal – Transit Master Plan

Monoyios presented, explaining this will initiate and updated Transit Master Plan (TMP). A new TMP will maximize the value that public transportation has as an MPO Planning priority and identify the strategic direction for public transportation over the next 20 years. In addition to the existing TMP being over 10 years old, the emergence

from the pandemic will require a comprehensive and exhaustive assessment to provide an up-to-date blueprint for the most effective and efficient regional transit provisions. Combining this TMP with other updated regional smart growth strategies will ensure the greatest impact public transportation can have for our region with our unified commitment to competitive and substantial growth.

Schweitzer noted the correlation between the Division Avenue Bus Lane Extension Study and the Transit Master Plan. LaGrand expressed support, explaining the positive relation to regional housing. Naramore mentioned the Central Needs Task Force in county-wide transit's potential involvement as well as the West Michigan Express. Naramore talked about first mile-last mile connections in the TMP. Bennett followed, stating the importance of scoping out the broadness of first mile-last mile and its possible involvements, including non-motorized safety. Monoyios agreed. Medura asked if there was going to be a lot of overlap in the proposals. Schweitzer said GVMC will be looking at the information in terms of developing a work program. Joseph said a lot of the discussion has highlighted the overlap and GVMC will look to combine work in the proposals to create more consolidated projects.

7th Project Proposal – Division Avenue Bus Lane Extension Study

Schweitzer presented, explaining the Division United Study is anticipated to recommend the extension of the existing bus lanes along the Silverline route at least as far south as 54th Street. It may be desirable to assess the utility and compliance with the current bus lane demarcations along the existing Silverline route as well as evaluate the prospect of the bus lane extension. The transportation elements analyzed should include non-motorized, existing transit, and existing and proposed traffic operations for passenger and freight vehicle movements.

8th Project Proposal – 100th Street Extension

Sprague presented, explaining the proposal is meant to study the traffic impacts of extending 100th St east from Kraft Ave to Duncan Lake Ave and upgrading 100th St between Duncan Lake Ave and Kinsey St to provide Primary Road Connection to M-37 (Cherry Valley Ave).

Tyler Kent stated this project supports other mobility efforts in the area. Bradshaw expressed support on behalf of Caledonia Township.

9th Project Proposal – Kraft/M-37 Connector

Sprague presented, explaining the proposal is meant to study the traffic impacts of constructing a new public street between Kraft Ave and M-37 (Cherry Valley Ave).

Tyler Kent stated this project supports other mobility efforts in the area, noting growth in the area. Schweitzer asked if 100th St had a clear route into Ottawa County. Sprague said yes.

10th Project Proposal - East Beltline Zoning Advisory Board

Schweitzer presented, proposing the consideration to resurrect a review board involving all the East Beltline communities from Caledonia Township and Village to the south to Grand Rapids and Plainfield Township in the north. The intent would be to partner with

KCRC and MDOT to review development proposals in the corridor in an effort to collectively and consistently balance land use and transportation design considerations.

Dennis Kent said this project could feed into other regional studies. Van Wyngarden echoed the need for study in that area.

11th Project Proposal - M-11 (Wilson Ave) Corridor Study

Dennis Kent presented, explaining generally, from I-196 north to the Remembrance Road Round-About, and west to I-96 in Walker and eastern Ottawa County; the study will include local parallel and cross streets as well as M-11, and identify needs, improvement option and priorities, which could include transit and non-motorized improvements, as well as state and local roadway improvement options.

Schmalzel expressed support, adding the corridor has seen a lot of activity over the years. Datema expressed support. Bennet expressed the need for non-motorized consideration on this study and others like it. Schweitzer agreed. Tyler Kent said it would be helpful to include something like that in the application.

Naramore asked Joseph to bring unspent federal PL dollars from prior years to next month's meeting.

VI. OTHER BUSINESS

Joseph said she recently sent a notice out about the new highway infrastructure funding that will be added to the next TPSG Subcommittee meeting.

Joseph said Bradley Doane will be reaching out to members in regard to updating the non-motorized facilities inventory.

VII. ADJOURNMENT

Schweitzer adjourned the February 17, 2021 Tech/Policy Committee meeting at 10:50am.

On behalf of MDOT, Grand Rapids, KCRC, Caledonia, The Rapid, Hope Network, OCRC, and Lowell the following amendments/modifications to the FY2020-2023 TIP are being requested. Here are the specific requests:

- MDOT is requesting the amendments/modifications to the TIP project list in the
 attached pending projects summary. MDOT is also requesting committee review
 of the S/TIP exempt project list. Many of the projects on this S/TIP exempt list
 have been reviewed by the Committees in the past, but MDOT staff may highlight
 a few of note during the meeting (please see attachments).
- The City of Grand Rapids has received a conditional commitment for a statewide TAP grant for the Grand River Edges trail from Leonard to Ann Street and are now requesting that this project be added to the TIP in FY2023. Grand Rapids is also requesting to modify a couple projects that are on illustrative lists (please see attachments).
- Kent County Road Commission is requesting to revise total project costs for two FY2021 projects. Federal funds are not impacted. Kent County has also received bridge funding for two FY2023 projects, which has triggered a GPA threshold amendment for the FY2023 Local Bridge GPA (see attachments).
- Caledonia has requested a total budget increase for their FY2021 project (see pending projects attachment).

- Ottawa County Road Commission has received bridge funding for a FY2023 bridge replacement project. Staff on OCRC's behalf is requesting its addition to the TIP (see pending projects attachment).
- Staff on behalf of The Rapid and Hope Network, is requesting committee
 review of the pending Transit Capital GPA projects, which when added/modified
 triggered a GPA threshold amendment for the FY2021 Transit Capital GPA (see
 pending projects attachment.
- The City of Lowell is requesting to increase the cost and limits of a FY2022
 project scheduled to receive small urban funds. As design has progressed, nonparticipating water and sewer work has been added and the limits have slightly
 increased, which have increased the total project cost (see attached).

RE: FY2020/FY2021 Funding Programming Recommendations

The TPSG Subcommittee met twice in March to make programming recommendations regarding FY2021 STP-Urban funds as well as additional FY2020 and FY2021 funds in the Highway Infrastructure Program (HIP) funding categories. The amounts of federal funds recommended for programming by TPSG are listed below.

- FY 2021 STP-Urban: \$218,881 (from City of Grandville project)
- FY 2020 HIP General: \$502,729 (must be obligated by 9/30/23, typical 80/20 or 81.85/18.15 required split)
- FY 2021 HIP General: \$540,111 (must be obligated by 9/30/24, typical 80/20 or 81.85/18.15 required split)
- FY 2021 HIP COVID Relief: \$3,693,347 (must be obligated by 9/30/24

 earlier obligation has been recommended, 100% federal no local match required)

TPSG recommends that the \$218,881 in STP-Urban funding be split among two FY21 projects that have not yet been obligated with \$37,760 going toward KCRC's Whitneyville Ave project and \$181,121 going to Grand Rapids' Lake Eastbrook Blvd project.

A call for projects was sent out for the HIP funding, and several proposals were submitted for consideration. TPSG reviewed these proposals along with

applicable performance measure data and made the recommendations for use of these funds in the attached table.

These recommendations were reviewed and recommended for approval by the Technical Committee at their April meeting.

RE: Proposed FY2022 Unified Planning Work Program Activities and Budget

The FY2022 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for the Grand Valley Metropolitan Council (GVMC) includes the budget for all federally assisted transportation planning activities that the GVMC Transportation Division, the Interurban Transit Partnership (ITP) and the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) will undertake. GVMC must submit the UPWP annually to the sponsoring federal agencies, Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration, prior to October 1st. It functions as the coordinated budget for the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO). Staff is requesting Policy Committee review and action on the draft FY2022 UPWP, so that it can go before the GVMC Board for final action at their May 6th meeting.

The draft FY2022 UPWP document and the associated budget to complete the included tasks is available for review on the GVMC UPWP webpage: www.gvmc.org/unified-planning-work-program. The work outlined in the program addresses all the federal planning factors, emphasis areas, and performance-based planning and programming requirements.

In response to feedback from members, GVMC will be leading efforts related to two special regional planning studies in FY2022: a regional transportation demand management study and an airport access study. Additionally, GVMC will be replacing the pavement data collection van, incorporating updated technology and additional capabilities developed in the 15 years since the original van was purchased. Other work highlights include a new performance monitoring subtask, development of a nonmotorized count database, and continuing implementation work related to recommendations from the 2045 MTP.

The GVMC Transportation Program receives its local match through dues assessed to the participating member agencies. While the program is expanding significantly, GVMC is planning to cover this expansion leaving dues **the same overall in FY2022.**
