II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Referring to Item II: Attachment A, D. Kent noted corrections (bolded below) to the March 15, 2023 Policy Committee minutes in the VIII. Other Business section under MDOT updates:

 "D. Kent provided updates to the US-131 Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) study. The Local Advisory Committee meeting for this is scheduled for March 24, and will meet again in April."

Van Wyngarden entertained the following motion:

MOTION by Schmalzel, SUPPORT by Madura, to approve the Technical and Policy Committee minutes dated December 7, 2022 as presented and the Policy Committee minutes dated March 15, 2023 as corrected. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

III. OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

No public comment.

IV. <u>TIP AMENDMENTS</u>

Referring to Item IV: Attachment A, Zonyk introduced the amendments to the FY2023-2026 TIP that were described in the agenda package. They are as follows:

MDOT

MDOT is requesting approval for five S/TIP line items. The line item amendments are due to added phases, added cost, and a change in fiscal year.

- The Fruit Ridge over I-96 bridge replacement project is being reactivated.
- The region wide traffic safety project is being abandoned due to added cost.
- The M-6/Holstege wetland mitigation project budget has increased over 25 percent, and MDOT has added culverts and PE phase funds.
- The US-131 reconstruction project has had a budget increase and a length reduction.
- The Leonard Street project is being delayed to a future S/TIP cycle to balance the budget in the current S/TIP.
- D. Kent added that the US-131 project is a large, statewide project that is part of the Rebuilding Michigan program. This project reflects the current cost and the modified limits to meet those costs.
- D. Kent also noted that on the S/TIP Exempt List, the US-131 project replacing joints from 28th Street to Pearl Street that was originally a FY2025 project has now been moved to FY2024. The Plaster Creek Bridge project south of Burton Street has discovered issues and this project has also been moved to FY2024. The bridge issue will be corrected; however, there will be full lane closures as it stands currently.

City of Grand Rapids

Grand Rapids is taking advantage of the federal buyout program for their Fuller Ave. from Kalamazoo Street to Adams Street reconstruction project, resulting in the construction phase being abandoned.

MOTION by Warren, SUPPORT by M. Bennett, to approve the TIP amendments requested by MDOT and the City of Grand Rapids. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

V. <u>FY2023 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM AMENDMENT (UPWP)</u>

Referring to Item V: Attachment A, Joseph introduced the amendment to the FY2023 UPWP.

Joseph stated that staff is requesting to amend the FY2023 UPWP to add budget and work activities for a Kent County Area Mobility Study. This project was

proposed by Kent County with their Mobility Task Force, and MDOT requested that GVMC be the grantee administering the project. This study will aim to evaluate mobility options, needs, and solutions for folks in the region, but will be informed by and coordinate with other regional mobility planning efforts such as GVMC's Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Plan and The Rapid's Transit Master Plan (TMP). Work for this study is expected to begin in the fall of this year, but the study has to be included in the FY2023 work program because the grant is FY2023 funding. The Mobility Study will not change anyone else's funding or any other tasks in the work program. This Mobility Study will be funded through a Service Development New Technology grant awarded through MDOT's Office of Passenger Transport, which is funded with FTA Section 5304 funds and state match. The total budget for this project is \$402,500. No additional local match is required.

Madura asked if this study would have to do with disability mobility, such as the Go!Bus. Pachla answered that the study will be a comprehensive needs analysis and an existing resources analysis. Joseph added that since GVMC is now the grant holder, they are focused on making sure that this effort is informed by and coordinated with both the Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Plan and The Rapid's Transit Master Plan (TMP) to ensure that efforts are not duplicated.

Schweitzer offered support for the Kent County Area Mobility Study and stated that he believes this is an important study for Kent County.

Joseph stated that if the Policy Committee recommends approval of these amendments, the amended draft will go before the Executive Committee and GVMC Board for final approval.

MOTION by Pachla, SUPPORT by Schweitzer, to recommend approval of the FY2023 Unified Planning Work Program Amendment. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

VI. FY2024 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP)

Referring to Item VI: Attachment A, Joseph introduced the discussion on the work activities for the FY2024 UPWP.

The FY2024 UPWP will contain many similar planning tasks as the FY2023 UPWP, but new work items in FY2024 include the development of a Regional Safety Action Plan utilizing SS4A grant funds awarded to GVMC and staff work on supplemental safety action planning activities using STP funds set aside for planning tasks. A task area has also been added to accommodate staff time needed to implement strategies that will come out of the Transportation Demand Management Plan, and a task under Technical Assistance was added for GVMC to assist/coordinate where appropriate on steps toward implementation of the Airport Access Study recommendations. Additionally, staff will utilize the required 2.5% PL set-aside for Safe and Accessible Options to work with partners on regional complete streets policy, guidance, and tools.

Wisselink added that any recommendations that come out of the Transit Master Plan will be ongoing.

MOTION by Madura, SUPPORT by Wisselink, to recommend approval of the FY2024 Unified Planning Work Program. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

VII. PAVEMENT, BRIDGE, AND RELIABILITY PERFORMANCE MEASURES

Referring to Item VII: Attachment A, Joseph presented the MDOT performance targets for the federal Pavement, Bridge, and Reliability System Performance Measures. Unlike the safety performance targets, targets for these measures are not approved on a yearly basis.

The final rules for the Pavement, Bridge, and Reliability System Performance Measure Targets became effective on May 20, 2017, with the bridge performance targets updated and approved by the Committees in 2020 based on a midperformance period review and adjustment.

Because the first performance period has been completed, GVMC must set targets again, with the deadline for approval on June 14th, 2023. Joseph noted that GVMC has been involved in target coordination meetings and working groups throughout the development process and that the newsletters included in the meeting packet outline the data the state uses to set these targets.

GVMC staff recommends that the Policy Committee take action to support the state targets for Pavement, Bridge, and Reliability Performance Measures for this reporting period.

Schweitzer asked if the Technical Committee recommended the support of the state targets. Joseph confirmed that they did recommend supporting state targets at their May 3 meeting.

MOTION by Ferrick, SUPPORT by Schmalzel, to support the Pavement, Bridge, and Reliability Performance Measure state targets. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

VIII. <u>AIRPORT ACCESS STUDY FINAL REPORT</u>

Referring to Item VIII: Attachment A, Joseph presented the Airport Access Study Final Report. The study has been going on for over a year, with several rounds of engagement, surveys, and open houses taking place during that time. At this point, it has gone through multiple rounds of alternatives analysis with a large amount of feedback and input from the public and stakeholders, which was critical.

Joseph presented the "Preferred Projects" list that came through the study process. All listed projects require more study, engineering, design, funding, etc. before they would be ready for implementation. Project details are included in the report.

While the document does not require formal committee approval, staff asked for recommendation of acceptance and acknowledgement of the study results to document regional support of the study.

Joseph thanked all involved, including the TAC, consultant team, and the committees.

Warren noted that the effort to improve access to the airport has a long history dating back to the 1990's. Kent County Road Commission was a "champion" for the effort back then, and Warren added he thinks there needs to be a follow up with the stakeholders to identify who the next "champion" is for this project to take it to the next level. He would encourage a motion to not only support or adopt the study, but to also request staff to possibly assemble the stakeholders in order to see where to go from here. With the new federal authorization bill and potential funding, it would be something to pursue. He added that the airport authority is key in this effort.

Joseph added that Ries from GRFIA couldn't be at the meeting today, but he did express support and thanked the group.

Madura asked how Cascade Township fit into this effort. Joseph noted that Cascade Township has been involved since the beginning of the study. Staff went to a Cascade Township Board meeting and held a well-attended open house in Cascade Township. Joseph added that it seemed the township's main concern was the potential interchanges along M-6, but none of those options are in the preferred projects list.

D. Kent added that he thinks there was initially a lack of understanding about the process, which is understandable. There was the expectation that the results of the Airport Access Study would be implemented next year, which is not the case. There are still steps that need to occur, and once that was understood, it appeared everyone was more comfortable with the study. Joseph agreed that there was initial confusion, but communicating more about the process helped.

Madura asked if in the future the M-6 proposed solutions were to come back into the picture, would property then have to bought back if development had already happened. Joseph noted that her understanding is that previously the Township's land use plans did designate future land use as industrial, but recently those priorities have changed and they want to have that land be preserved as agriculture and green space.

D. Kent added that MDOT owns a fair amount of property along M-6 and 48th street, but the focus right now is on preserving what they have. He added that for advanced acquisition, MDOT does not typically buy property until there is a committed project and funding for it, which at this point there is not either.

Schweitzer added that it is important that planning for access to the airport is incorporated into the master plans of the various communities surrounding the airport and noted that Cascade will be key in this in terms of preferred alternatives.

MOTION by Warren, SUPPORT by Pachla, to accept the results of the Airport Access Study Final Report. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

IX. OTHER BUSINESS

GVMC

- Joseph introduced GVMC's two new summer interns, Romeo Ferrer and Dru Hajec.
- Joseph reminded the Committee that GVMC is in the process of updating the MTP and announced a new public involvement exercise related to the needs analysis, which is a MTP bingo game.
- Joseph reminded the Committee that there are two subcommittee meetings happening next week – Safety and Non-Motorized.
- O Joseph noted that Golder, Sprague, Haagsma, a representative from the Kent County Health Department, and herself attended the Walkability Action Institute last week. One thing they must do is find good and challenging things related to walkability in the region. Joseph asked if the Committee has specific examples that they would like to be reviewed, to let her know.

MDOT Updates

- D. Kent noted that the US-131 Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) study is continuing and there will be an in-person survey of the public in June or July. MDOT has funding from the state to continue design impact assessment around the Wealthy Street interchange.
- D. Kent gave updates on the M-37 environmental assessment for the Caledonia project. MDOT has received a letter of initiation from the FHWA and they are continuing work on it.
- Schweitzer added that since the implementation of the MDOT safety service vehicle, he has personally seen it several times and thinks it is a great service, and he thanked MDOT and the Committee for their efforts on this.

III. OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

No public comment.

IV. TIP AMENDMENTS

Referring to Item IV: Attachment A, Zonyk introduced the amendments to the FY2023-2026 TIP that were described in the agenda package. They are as follows:

MDOT

MDOT is requesting approval for the addition of a 2023 project that will include enhanced wrong-way detection and warning devices, as well as other projects on the S/TIP exempt list.

- D. Kent added that MDOT received a grant for wrong-way driver detection and warning devices. These warning signs and lights will be installed on interchanges and ramps on US-131 between M-11 and Ann Street. This ended up not being an amendment, but part of the traffic safety general program account. MDOT is combining the grant money received with internal funds. D. Kent noted that wrong-way crashes are often serious crashes that do not end well, and MDOT is trying to figure out why these crashes are increasing.
- D. Kent added that another project on the S/TIP exempt list is signal upgrades on M-37 between 68th and 52nd Street. He added that for FY2024, there is a joint repair project on US-131 between M-11 and Pearl Street, and work on the Plaster Creek bridge which will result in short closures along US-131 next year.

Kent County

Two sidewalk projects are being added on behalf of Kent County following their navigation through the MGS process. These are TMA funded projects previously recommended by the Nonmotorized and TPSG committees. These additions have triggered the need for an amendment to the 2025 Local Livability and Sustainability GPA.

City of Lowell

The City of Lowell has a year change and grant funding additions for their River Valley Rail connection requiring an amendment needing committee approval.

City of Grand Rapids

Based on the most recent engineer's estimates, the City of Grand Rapids is requesting budget changes on two of their 2023 regional TAP projects, one of which has triggered a federal amendment to the FY2023 Local Livability and Sustainability GPA.

The Rapid

The Rapid has been awarded a discretionary Low or No Emission award for the purchase of replacement 40-foot Compressed Natural Gas vehicles and is requesting to add the project to the TIP in FY2023.

Wisselink added that this past spring, The Rapid applied for the 5339(c) discretionary grant for \$7,746,475 to purchase 11 CNG buses. These CNG buses will be run with compressed natural gas from the City of Grand Rapids' biodigester.

City of Walker

Using the regional emergency amendment policy, allowing Tech and Policy Committee chair/vice-chair approval and a week-long public review period for urgent project amendments that do not impact any other TIP projects, the City of Walker's Bristol Street bridge project was submitted for federal approval on July 13 following budget changes that increased the total project budget by more than 25%. No change to the amount of federal funding was requested. This was expedited due to the potential of losing obligation authority in the context of previous complications with losing Covid relief funds.

Conners added that after MDOT jumped in to replace the Covid funds, the City of Walker discovered that their estimate was higher, which increased the overall cost. This is just to increase the overall cost and does not change the funding.

MOTION by Madura, SUPPORT by Suchy, to approve the TIP amendments requested by MDOT, Kent County, the City of Lowell, the City of Grand Rapids, The Rapid, and the City of Walker. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

V. 2050 MTP NEEDS AND DEFICIENCIES ANALYSIS

Referring to Item V: Attachment A, Faber introduced the discussion of the 2050 MTP needs and deficiencies analysis.

As part of the 2050 MTP development process, GVMC staff has completed a series of needs analyses for air travel, freight movement, nonmotorized, passenger rail, pavement condition, traffic congestion, transit, and safety.

To determine current and future transportation needs by mode, GVMC considered public comment, input from stakeholders and Committees representing various transportation modes, and performance measure targets the Committee previously supported. Once approved, these analyses will be the basis for proposing solutions to meet the current and forecasted transportation needs by mode for the 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP).

To enhance public participation, GVMC launched a bingo game that asked the public to participate in a variety of transportation-related activities to earn a bingo.

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ITEM II: ATTACHMENT A

The game ends with the participants submitting their bingo card with a comment that compares their experience with the transportation system to the results of GVMC's needs analysis. The bingo game, along with the public comment opportunity for the needs analysis, launched on June 15. Both will conclude on July 12. All participants will receive a summer fun safety kit from GVMC, and larger prizes will be awarded through a drawing. At the time the agenda packet was sent out, GVMC had received 13 bingo cards and 13 comments on the needs analysis. Since then, GVMC has received another bingo and 2 additional comments. Faber distributed one comment to the committee and shared another verbally. Staff is evaluating the feedback received and will address comments as applicable in the MTP and include them in the document's appendix.

Staff is requesting approval of the needs analysis which will allow staff to move forward with the next phases of MTP development. Next steps include selecting preferred alternatives to address current and projected system needs and deficiencies and creating a financially constrained project list.

Faber thanked the Committees for their support and for sharing the bingo game with the public. GVMC received more public comments this time than for the previous MTP needs analysis. Not only was there an increase in participation, but GVMC also received many thoughtful comments from the public.

MOTION by Thornton, SUPPORT by Van Wyngarden, to approve GVMC's modal needs analysis. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

K. Bennett asked what the timeline is with the next steps for the MTP. Faber answered that the next step is to conduct the financial analysis. Faber will be contacting everyone about financials via email within the next few weeks. The financial analysis will then be compared to the needs analysis to determine shortfalls. Then the MTP steering committee will meet, and priorities will be discussed. GVMC is looking to have the 2050 MTP completed by June 2024.

VI. <u>OTHER BUSINESS</u>

MDOT Updates

- D. Kent noted that MDOT has a few ongoing long-term projects. One is the M-37 project from 92nd to 76th Street. MDOT is still working through the environmental assessment and the resource analysis for this project. There is also a public involvement plan that is currently being reviewed by MDOT internally. The goal is to have the project under construction in late 2024.
- T. Kent added that MDOT is working with Conners on the Fruitridge interchange access change request. MDOT is also working on a Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-saving Transportation Program (PROTECT) grant application. This grant will be for replacing the pump station at 28th Street and Division Ave. because the current pump station is approaching its lifespan. MDOT

may reach out to communities for letters of support for the pump station, road reconstruction, or road drainage projects associated with replacing the pump station.

Walters gave an update on obligation authority. As of mid-last week, roughly 90% of obligation authority had been used for the year. Currently, 20 of the 36 local projects have been obligated. Walters reminded the Committees to get their projects obligated as soon as possible, and if the obligation authority runs out to continue to submit projects. MDOT is expecting to receive an August redistribution, which will be given on a first come first served basis.

SS4A Action Planning Grant Update

Faber announced that GVMC has received and signed the final grant agreement from FHWA for the Safe Streets for All grant and are waiting for the fully executed copy. Staff is working on drafting the request for proposals to hire a consultant to help develop the action plan. This planning effort will be led by the Safety Committee. Staff will likely send the draft RFP to the entire Safety Committee for feedback and then look to form a smaller subcommittee to assist in proposal evaluation. Staff plans to advertise this prior to the end of the summer, so that selection and work can begin as soon as possible around the start of the next fiscal year. Faber asked if the Committees had any feedback on this plan.

K. Bennett asked what the budget is for the plan. Faber noted she believes it was \$240,000, and then Joseph would like to look at adding additional funding to that budget. Naramore added that the City of Grand Rapids would bridge a small gap if needed and emphasized the benefit of a regional application for this plan.

Harrall asked what the timing is for the plan. Faber answered that the majority of the work will take place in FY2024. Naramore added that Joseph planned to ask FHWA how much of the process needs to be completed before jurisdictions can begin applying for the grants.

Updated FY2024 Funding Estimates

Faber noted that GVMC has received updated funding estimates for FY2024. A few programs went down slightly, but there was a net gain of funding of about \$494,000. Currently, the majority of projects programmed with STP-Urban funding have a federal share of about 70% and it would take more than the \$494,000 available to get projects to 80% federal. Staff will set up a TSPG Subcommittee meeting in August to discuss programming recommendations, which could include proportionally increasing the federal share on underfunded STP-Urban projects across the board, moving a project or projects from the Illustrative list into the TIP with this funding, etc. Then these recommendations will be brought through the Committees at the September meetings. Faber asked if the Committees had any

inclination of the direction they would prefer so that staff can prepare meeting materials and information accordingly.

Faber added that the August Technical and Policy Committee meetings will most likely be cancelled, but TPSG will meet. Then the Technical and Policy Committees will meet in September.

 Harrall announced that the September Policy Committee meeting will be Steve Warren's last Policy meeting. Harrall reached out to Joseph and this meeting will be held at the new Kent County Road Commission building. KCRC will be fully moved into this new building by the end of the first week of August.

VII. <u>ADJOURNMENT</u>

Naramore adjourned the July 19, 2023, combined Technical and Policy Committee meeting at 9:56 a.m.

On behalf of MDOT, Kent County, GVMC, and Walker the following amendments/modifications to the FY2023-2026 TIP are being requested:

- MDOT is requesting approval for budget increases, delays, removals, and funding source changes as highlighted in the attached table. They are also adding bridge rehabilitation and CPM funds triggering a GPA amendment for Trunkline Bridge. Enclosed is also the S/TIP exempt project list and MDOT staff will provide highlights as necessary (please see attachments).
- KCRC is requesting to add Rural Exchange funds purchased from Mecosta County for their 100th St reconstruction project. This is triggering an amendment due to the cost increase. Enclosed is a memo also highlighting three other amendments that were administrative modifications acted on by staff upon their request (please see attachments).
- GVMC has a duplicate job for FY 2023 using CMAQ funds that needs to be deleted as a technical correction. This requires an amendment (please see attachments).
- The City of Walker has seen a significant cost increase for their Kinney Avenue project scheduled for 2024 using STP funds. There will not be additional grant funding as part of this request, but the increase in local funds will trigger a TIP amendment based on estimates they've provided in their memo (please see attachments).








TIP Amendment Process

GVMC regularly amends the TIP to reflect changes to the list of projects. These changes include modifications to the cost of projects, scope, description, and fiscal years. Projects may also be added and deleted. While some changes are able to be made by GVMC staff, others require a formal amendment, which includes approval by the GVMC Technical and Policy Committees, MDOT, and by the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA).

An amendment to the TIP is required if:

- A project is added or deleted from the list
- The cost of a project increases by 25% or more
- Project scope changes significantly

The City of Walker has seen significant increases in project cost on many of our projects. In particular, the Kinney Avenue project scheduled for 2024 STP funding, has seen the overall project cost nearly double. Our construction estimate in late 2021 was \$2,700,000. The engineers estimate for construction is now estimated at \$4,550,000, before adding any additional contingencies.

We are requesting that our total project cost in the TIP be increased to \$4,550,000 to allow for this project to be processed through the obligation and letting process. We understand that our STP grant will not be increased as part of this request. We are working on closing the budget gap with local funding. We are committed to ensuring that these funds are obligational early in the 2024 fiscal cycle and leveraged locally here in Walker and in the GVMC region.

RE: FY2024 Funding Allocations and Programming

GVMC recently received updated revenue targets for FY2024. A summary of what needs to be recommended for programming in FY2024 is as follows:

^{*}Because EDC is a state funding source, these funds have more flexibility related to the fiscal year to which they can be applied.

TPSG met on August 14, 2023, and developed a list of recommended changes to the FY2024 TIP list to align with these new targets and remain fiscally constrained as federally required. The Technical Committee recommended approval of these recommendations on September 6 and now action is being requested by the Policy Committee.

TPSG/Tech recommendations by funding source are summarized below. The list of recommended project changes is attached.

STP-Flex-Kent County:

- Impacts one City of Walker project (Kinney Ave Reconstruction)
 - TPSG recommends lowering the federal amount for this funding source by \$67,000 to align with the new target.

Carbon Reduction Program

- Only one project programmed with this funding source is not currently programmed with maximum federal participation – City of Walker's roundabout project at Center Drive NW
 - TPSG recommends increasing the federal amount by \$66,000 to align with the new target and also almost balance the amount lost on Walker's Kinney Ave project.

STP-Rural-Kent County

- Impacts one KCRC project (100th Street Reconstruction)
 - TPSG recommends lowering the federal amount for this funding source by \$34,000 to align with the new target and supplementing the loss with STP-TMA funds.

STP-Flex-TMA and STP-TMA

- TPSG recommends allocating \$228,000 to The Rapid to supplement the COVID Relief funding that was clawed back by Congress after the Debt Ceiling Deal.
 - When the word came down that unobligated COVID Relief funding was going to be rescinded as part of Congress' debt ceiling deal this summer, it was indicated that the applicable funds that had been allocated to transit projects would not be clawed back. However, that turned out to not be the case and without additional funding, The Rapid's project would be \$285,000 short while the planning process has already begun.
 - MDOT Office of Passenger Transportation has agreed to provide the 20% match required.
- TPSG recommends the remainder of the surplus STP-Flex-TMA funds (\$22,000) be combined with the remainder of the surplus STP-TMA funds to bring STP-TMA projects closer to maximum federal participation as most of the projects with this funding source were programmed with more than the required amount of local match.

RE: 2020 Adjusted Census Urban Area (ACUB) Boundary Modification

Following the decennial census, federal law allows MDOT and the MPOs the option to modify its Urban Area Boundary as it relates to changes in population growth since the last census. GVMC received notification to participate and suggest any changes to modify this Adjusted Census Urban Boundary (ACUB), adhering to the federal guidelines. The areas we are responsible for include the small urban areas of Allendale, Lowell, and Sparta, and the Grand Rapids urban area.

This boundary affects distribution of Act 51 monies for the road agencies, and it also serves as the dividing line for urban and rural roads TIP monies and their associated funding sources for projects on the federal aid road network. *It's important to note boundary changes do not increase Act 51 or MPO TIP funding amounts.*

MDOT's team provided maps for us to review and coordinate with our members for the modification. Invitations were sent to our MPO members, ITP and our Tribal affiliates to collaborate with us and MDOT for the modification. MDOT presented the review criteria and hosted a workshop on June 28th to allow us to smooth and adjust our Urban Area boundary as needed. In attendance were MDOT, the road commissions, and Township agencies.

Following this meeting, MDOT compiled the changes for final review in hardcopy map and GIS formats. The map provided reflects our efforts and the adjustments that were submitted to MDOT for review. The online application depicting the new proposed ACUB boundary can be found at the following link. Be sure to turn on the "Proposed 2020 ACUB Layer" to see this new boundary.

Because of time sensitivity and where our meetings dates fell we needed the approval from the Executive Committee on August 17th so that it could go to the GVMC Board for final approval on September 7th to meet the January 2024 deadline. Because of this, it is being brought forth to the Technical and Policy Committees in September as informational.

The final step for the MPO is to submit a signed resolution letter to MDOT from the Metro Council approving the adjustment with a signature obtained from the Chair, along with a transit agency, and Tribal Councils (if available). MDOT will then be submitting the collective modification efforts statewide to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) in January, 2024.

Until the proposed 2020 ACUB boundaries are approved by the FHWA and entered within the MDOT databases in 2025, the 2010 ACUB's will continue to be in effect.
