IV. FY2017-2020 TIP AMENDMENTS/MODIFICATIONS

Referring to **Item IV: Attachment A,** Joseph went over the requests to amend the FY2017-2020 TIP. There were requests from MDOT, the City of Wyoming, the Kent County Road Commission and Staff on behalf of KCRC/Nelson County to formally add some TAP projects that previously went through the committee process and recently received commitments though the Michigan Grant System.

Kent delivered a presentation of the MDOT projects.

Green followed up with more detail and the upcoming schedule to include additional projects through FY2020.

Joseph began to explain that the City of Wyoming had everything ready for their FY2018 TAP project; however obligation authority ran out. They are requesting it now be moved to FY2019. It will not affect funding on any other FY2019 TAP project. Kent County is also moving a project from FY2018 to FY2019.

Joseph added that the Kent County Road Commission is requesting to adjust the budgets of a couple of their FY2019 projects in order to utilize the funds for a project they are moving from 2018 to 2019. They are also adding a bridge project.

Joseph discussed the City of Grand Rapids request to switch the 7th Street project with the Hastings Street project and a couple technical corrections on the limits for their projects in FY2020.

Joseph explained that there are pending projects coming out of JobNet mostly because of GPAs. In between the Technical Committee and Policy Committee, JobNet reset all of the GPAs thresholds. None of the project budgets are reset, just the budget for the general program account. All of the GPA thresholds will need to be approved again. Joseph pointed out the list with the GPAs in the back of the agenda packet.

for consideration. The Technical Committee recommended approval. There was one final chance to comment on the Public Participation Plan at today's meeting.

VI. <u>TIP 2020-2023 DEFICIENCY LIST</u>

Referring to Item VI: Attachment A, Itani discussed that the staff has completed collecting data on system condition and capacity deficiencies. Maps were displayed and an example of the Draft Deficiency List and Field Definitions were provided to the committee. One of the changes in defining the deficiencies was using peak hours instead of daily deficiencies. We're able to mark time of day, volumes and capacities which gives a more microscopic view on where the congestion is occurring. The condition is same as before, using PASER. There is additional IRI data provided on the NHS system on the deficiency list that is being passed on as supplemental data. Safety is a new deficiency, and we are using state targets for serious injuries and fatalities for 100 million vehicles traveled. Using as characteristics to flag whether a segment is deficient.

A copy of the Deficiencies List was recently supplied to our member jurisdictions as part of a call for projects for the 2020-2023 TIP on November 22nd. Included in the listing are characteristics on capacity, condition, and safety deficiencies with additional information related to federal performance measures, transit proximity, and the non-motorized plan.

VII. OTHER BUSINESS

Naramore asked the status for the CMAQ funding for FY2020. Itani responded that nothing changed for FY2020. For FY2021-FY2023 it will be decreased to half the funds.

Itani also added that STP funding will be going up 2-3%. The TPSG Committee will be meeting December 3rd and 5th to discuss funding.
