#### IV. FY2017-2020 TIP AMENDMENTS/MODIFICATIONS

Referring to **Item IV: Attachment A,** Joseph went over the requests to amend the FY2017-2020 TIP. Requests from MDOT, City of Wyoming, Kent County Road Commission and Staff on behalf of KCRC/Nelson County to formally add some TAP projects that previously went through the committee process and recently received conditional commitments though the Michigan Grant System. Will also go over some reports from JobNet.

Kent discussed the MDOT projects and added that the internal funding for the Fuller to I-96 project was approved. Just questioning the air quality guidelines.

Itani added that currently the TIP can be amended; however, by February 16, 2019, there needs to be an air quality analysis on the TIP approved. He stated that the MDOT project would move forward because it was before the February 16 deadline. Itani also added that no projects will be amended after November due to the air quality analysis that needs to be complete and approved.

Kent asked that it be noted that the amount went up due to the air quality analysis and by the cost of adding the reconstruction of I-96. New bridges that have been discussed can be built as the projects are working together.

Kent also discussed the Pavement Marking Projects that are in the amendment cycle. There are region wide pavement marking contracts but because they cover more than one MPO they need to be listed separately. They are covering all trunk lines.

Joseph began to explain that the City of Wyoming had everything ready for their FY2018 TAP project; however, obligation authority ran out. They are requesting it now be moved to the FY2019. It will not affect funding on any other FY2019 TAP project. Kent County is also moving a project from FY2018 to FY2019. Harrall discussed each of the projects.

Joseph explained she was working with MDOT, office of passenger transport and FTA to figure out JobNet clarifications.

Joseph explained the JobNet reports and the reasons given in the federal amendment type column. A majority of them are a result of GPA threshold issues and some are actual and some are JobNet. Also, asking approval of the GPA Target Report thresholds in the GPA proposed amounts. Specifically looking at GPAs that don't have an MPO approval date. Joseph explained that some of the TAP projects were bumped out of the GPA when they transitioned from the old spreadsheet file to the new online data base "JobNet." Some of those were able to be moved back in. The new GPA target report reflects the bigger threshold proposed amount for the local livability and sustainability GPA. The new threshold numbers are 2.3 million in FY2019 and the proposed new additional amount will be almost 1.9 million. FY2020 the new proposed amount will be 2.25 million. Discussion ensued.

#### V. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PLAN

Referring to **Item V: Attachment A**, Faber stated that in September, staff brought the draft Public Participation Plan to the Technical Committee for consideration. The Plan concludes its required 45-day public comment period today. Five comments have been received during the comment period, and one comment was received in 2014, which was considered as we revised the document. None of the comments have resulted in changes in the content of the draft document. Faber asked the Committee to recommend approval of the final Public Participation Plan to the Policy Committee, and noted that if any comments are received later today, that they will be brought directly to the Policy Committee.

# MOTION by Harrall, SUPPORT by Bradshaw, to recommend approval the 2018 Public Participation Plan to the Policy Committee. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

#### VI. TIP 2020 – 2023 DEFICIENCY LIST

Please refer to **Item VI: Attachment A,** Zonyk discussed that his item was added to the agenda to piggyback on the recent project for the FY2020-FY2023 TIP that Joseph sent out a few weeks ago with an attached deficiencies list. An example of Draft Deficiency List and Field Definitions were provided. One of the changes in defining the deficiencies was using peak hour instead of daily deficiencies. We're able to mark time of day, volumes and capacities which gives a more microscopic view on where the congestion is occurring. Zonk used maps that were set up to explain. Condition is same as before, using PASER. There is additional IRI data provided on the NHS system on the Deficiency list that is being passed on as supplemental data. Safety, a new deficiency, using state targets for serious injuries and fatalities for 100 million vehicles traveled. Using as characteristics to flag whether a segment is deficient.

#### VII. <u>OTHER BUSINESS</u>

Joseph advised the committee, based on the Doodle poll, that the upcoming TPSG meetings will be held on December 3 and 4.

Itani added that the state is showing a 6.5 million dollar surplus and that it is unknown where it is coming from. Needed to confirm that it is not a mistake.

Itani also explained the new process for the FY2017-2020 TIP and Transportation Plan going through the air quality conformity analysis.

Harrall advised to have projects in the TIP by October 1, 2019 to avoid delays in projects. Beginning FY2020 verification will be required for planning projects.

DeVries asked if communities that submit projects for the illustrative list, will include air quality conformity. Itani cannot include illustrative projects because it is not committed and does not have a construction schedule.

Itani advised to send the committee a list of all exempt project types.

Kent advised that MDOT has a New Director, Mark VanPort Fleet.
