IV. FY2017-2020 TIP AMENDMENTS/MODIFICATIONS

Referring to **Item IV: Attachment A,** Robinson explained that they will need to open up public comment for the committee due to a couple projects requesting to be included in the TIP. Robinson goes on to discuss the changes and modifications to the current TIP. MDOT, KCRC, ITP-The Rapid, City of Wyoming, and the City of Grand Rapids are all requesting changes or modifications to their TIP projects. Those changes or modifications are listed below:

MDOT-FY2017 ITS Control Room Operations project is being removed and put in the statewide TIP. FY2017 and FY 2019 Overhead Sign Upgrade/Replacement project are new Trunkline projects for MDOP.

KCRC-Robinson explains that this project was one not included in the TIP but wants to be added to the current TIP. Peach Ridge Ave, resurfacing project. Location- South 18 mile rd. to 21 mile rd. Rural STP funds=\$540,000, Total project cost=\$785,000. KCRC is planning to purchase \$540,000 of 2017 Rural STP funds from another Road Commission in order to complete this project in FY 2017. Also requesting to extend the limits of the 2017 Byron Center Ave. resurfacing project from 76th to 68th St. north to 64th St. The new limits would be 76th st. to 64th st. and the funding amount does not change. **This project is not included in the TIP; it is open to public comment for approval to be added to the TIP.**

MOTION by Zull, SUPPORT by McConnon, to open up for public comment the KCRC Peach Tree Project, the City of Grand Rapids Kalamazoo Ave. Project and the MDOT Sign Project to be added to the TIP. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Harrall asked for public comment. Hearing none, he motioned to the committee to close the public comment.

MOTION by Conners, SUPPORT by Arends, to close public comment on the KCRC Peach Ridge Project, the City of Grand Rapids Kalamazoo Ave. Project and the MDOT Sign Project and to add them to the TIP. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Harrall asked for comments on each amendment. Hearing none, he asked for a motion.

MOTION by Harden, SUPPORT by Ghearing, to approve the FY2017-2020 TIP amendments/modifications and additions. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

V. <u>FY 2018-2020 TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM (TAP)</u>

Refering **to Item V: Attachment A,** Zonyk explained to the committee that the TPSG committee met on October 24, 2016 to allocate funding for FY 2018-2020. The formal objective of the meeting was to approve the FY2017 Project List. FY2018 is over programmed, FY2019 is under programmed, and FY2020 is over programmed. Robinson stated that MDOT suggested that everyone with a potential project on the 2018-2020 list submit the project into MGS to go through the MDOT technical review process. The results of that review process could potentially be used to inform the final programming decisions, especially for 2019 and 2020.

One suggestion to remedy the FY 2018 over programming was to reduce the total cost of the City of Hudsonville's Buttermilk Creek Pathway project by \$200,000. The City could then apply for MDOT TAP funds for the remaining cost or potentially utilize an advance construct option with 2019 funds. Strikwerda stated that the paperwork for this project has been submitted on October 31, 2016. Harrall stated that Mike Smith from MDOT suggested over programming in case some projects need to drop out. Itani suggested that they approve 2017, advance construct \$100,000 from the \$600,000 to 2019. Change the match for 2020 to make it financially constrained or \$100,000 over. Itani explained that 2020 is speculative at best. New funding sources, new transportation bill will be available. If the Hudsonville project gets approved for the TAP funding then the committee can revisit the TIP at a later date.
